While our new website sports a new look, we also hope that you will find it informative and easy to connect to resources that will help you through the different stages of raising a child with epilepsy. For new families, we always suggest connecting with other parents who understand and share similar experiences raising a child with epilepsy. The Resource tab will take you to the "Discovering My Epilepsy Support Group" link where you can fill out a family intake form online. You can also connect to the Support Group through Facebook by searching for "Discovering My Epilepsy." Here are just a few new links that have been added to the website.

A new "FAQ" link appears under the "What is Epilepsy" tab and we have expanded the number of sites available through "Helpful Links" under the Resources tab. There are links to many national sites, but we have included links to local and state resources too. We tried to provide general information in response to commonly asked questions that we receive at The Matty Fund Epilepsy Resource Center. For example, as the school year gets underway, many parents have questions about Individualized Educational Plan's (IEP's). The web site provides a link to the RI Dept. of Elementary and Secondary Education's "IEP Process and Frequently Asked Questions" along with information about The Extended School Year. There are links to local and state organizations that provide services and resources to youth with disabilities who are in transition to adulthood and independence including the RI Dept. of Health (Special Health Care Needs), the RI Parent Information Network and the Sherlock Center on Disabilities. The RI Disability Law Center is another great resource that provides free legal assistance to people with disabilities. A link to the "The Assistive Technology Exchange of New England" is a free "classified ad" type resource designed to help people find, buy, sell or give away used AT equipment.

Raise Epilepsy Awareness in School!

The Matty Hatty Dance-A-Thon is a statewide epilepsy awareness program created by the Matty Fund for elementary and preschools. The goal of Matty Hatty is to eliminate the social stigma associated with this disease and teach seizure protocols to children at an early age.
